By this deep ploughing, the worn out foil being tu ned in, the fecond firatum, or fresh earth, will be uppermost ; which having never been ex. haufted, by being exposed to the air, and froit and fnow of winter, is there. by fweetened and cleanfed of all its impurities, and becomes a new fresh. and fertiliz'd earth, in the best pollible state for vegetation.

Many farmers will probably object to this method, on account of its being attended with a little extra expence; but I with farmers would confider firit, that it will be a great faving to him, if, infletd of going on to exhault one field after another till he has worn out the whole of his land, he by this method recovers it. He will fave labor in the fpring, and will be ready to fow as foon as the weather will permit.
