

Fredericton, N. B., June 28—(Special)—
The June term of the York circuit court opened this morning, Judge Landry presiding. There was no criminal business and the docket contained only one civil case, that of Martin Kennedy vs. Margaret Gorman, an action for trespass. Twenty-one grand jurors answered to their names and elected William Jeffrey foreman. In addressing them, Judge Landry expressed the opinion that the administration of justice could be carried on more satisfactorily without grand jurors, and if grand jurors were necessary, six men could perform the duty as well as twenty-three. In regard to criminal cases he thought they could be dealt with satisfactorily by two judges, a third to be added if necessary. The grand jurors having no presentments to make, they were discharged.
