

PRICE RECOVERY CONTINUES IN TWO MARKETS

St. Maurice Paper, After 10-Point Jump Yesterday, Up Again Today

FURTHER PROGRESS MADE IN WALL STREET

General Motors Advances Five Points on Expectation of Extra Dividend

MONTREAL, Nov. 12.—The recovery of prices, begun yesterday after an early period of liquidation, continued in the early trading on the local stock market this morning. National Breweries and Smelters were quite active, the former rising 1-2 to 52-1-4, and the latter 3-1-2 to 136. St. Maurice Paper, which featured yesterday's market, with a 10 point

advance to 103, was up another point to 104. Other leaders this morning were Brazilian and Montreal Power, up 1-4 to 767-8 and up 1-2 to 210 respectively. The only other change was in Wayagamack, a board lot of which changed hands at 63, up 2. Belgo Paper preferred sold unchanged at 88.

WALL ST. ADVANCES.
NEW YORK, Nov. 12.—With its technical structure plainly strengthened by the recent reaction, the stock market made further progress on its recovery at today's opening. Expectations of a large extra dividend by General Motors at today's meeting, sent that stock up more than five points, making it the feature of the initial dealings. Gains of 1 to 3 points embraced American Sugar, U. S. Steel, American Can, Fisher Body, Studebaker, Owens Bottle and Baldwin.

EVIDENCE GIVEN IN CASE OF LAWYERS

Matters Mentioned in Application for Disbarment of Saint John Men

Before the council of the Barriers' Society at Fredericton on Tuesday night evidence in the matter of Roy A. Davidson was given by Dr. W. B. Wallace K. C., and in the matter of Sidney H. Hutton by Hon. J. B. M. Baxter K. C., in the proceedings which led to application before the Supreme Court for the disbarment of Davidson and Hutton, two young Saint John lawyers. K-ADD ST JOHN LAWYERS
Hon. Dr. Baxter stated that Hutton had been a member of his firm, Baxter, Lewin, Carter and Hutton. On Sept. 21 witness was informed that Hutton was not at his office and not at Hampton where he was supposed to be searching records. He also learned that Hutton had sold a quantity of bonds to Thomas, Armstrong and Bell. Subsequently he learned that Hutton had entered the United States on a 10-day permit and that his car had broken down and been abandoned. On Oct. 12 Eva Smith came to his office to cut coupons on war bonds owned by herself, her mother and her sister. The bonds were missing from the place where they were kept. The total value was \$3,800.

BOND MISSING.
There was also a bond for \$500 owned by George S. Cushing, to which had been attached a slip stating the circumstances of the bond being there and giving the name of the owner. The slip was found but the bond was missing. It was evident that Hutton had sold the bonds to Thomas, Armstrong and Bell, said Dr. Baxter. Hutton had asked Miss Rogers, who was employed at the office, for the combination of the vault, stating that he had forgotten it. The whereabouts of Hutton were unknown to the witness.

Dr. Wallace stated that as solicitor of the Dominion Bank he had been called into consultation with regard to a draft for \$2,054 drawn by the Nova Scotia Building and Loan Society in favour of J. Roy Campbell and another party. The proceeds of this draft had been credited to Roy A. Davidson. Witness had seen a letter written by the Bank of Nova Scotia at Halifax about this matter. There had been endorsement by J. Roy Campbell, who had acknowledged he had endorsed it, and also by the other party. Duns' commercial record showed that a mortgage for \$2,000 had been drawn the same date as the draft. The mortgage had been given by a man and his wife, later found to be non-existent to another non-existent person. The deed in the transaction had been acknowledged before Davidson. The mortgage given to the Nova Scotia Building and Loan Society also had been entered before Davidson. The property mentioned in the mortgage was situated in Tower street, West Saint John. Witness had investigated and found all the persons mentioned in the transactions fictitious. The whereabouts of Davidson were unknown to the witness.

Donald W. Armstrong, of the firm of Thomas, Armstrong and Bell, said last night that the firm had no statement to make in reference to the evidence of Dr. Baxter that Hutton had sold bonds to Thomas, Armstrong and Bell.
