

FOUR SAW THEIR WAY OUT OF JAIL

Belfast, Me., Oct. 15.—Four Boston boys, committed to jail last week, broke out and made a getaway on Thursday. They are known as the Boston quartet, and are William J. Scannell, Joseph Gorey, George Darragh and Arthur Digan. With the exception of Darragh, who is serving ten months, the boys were committed for eight months each, having pleaded guilty to the theft of an automobile in Belfast, June 18, since which time they have been in jail here. Darragh has made two other unsuccessful attempts to break jail.

The boys sawed the bars from their cells and from a window at the back of the jail. A hack-saw was found near the window. It is believed they had outside help as no possible trace has been found of them up to noon today. Their absence was not discovered until this morning at breakfast time. The four other occupants of the jail claim to know nothing of the break.

The quartet is also wanted in Bangor for breaking and entering and for the theft of an automobile, to which they have confessed. They came here from Bangor with stolen plunder and said that they were on their way back to
