### TELEGRAPHERS MAY NOT ACCEPT AWARD

Toronto, Aug. 1.—The award of the Board of Conciliation on the demands of Canadian Pacific Railway Telegraph employees was announced officially Saturday. It gives increases as follows: Morse operators, \$20 to \$17 a month; clerk, \$12.50 to \$5 a month; printing telegraphers \$10 a month.

A ballot is being taken among the telegraph employees, of whom 200 in Toronto and about 1,000 in Canada are effected, as to whether the terms will be accepted. The men's original demands were for more than double the increases offered by the award. The present rate of pay ranges from \$100 to \$185 a month for Morse telegraphers; \$90 to \$100 for printing telegraphers and \$45 to \$125 a month for clerks.

The opinion was expressed by W. C. Storey, local chairman for the provincial organization committee, that, judging from the ballot now being taken, the telegraphers are against acceptance.

### MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

An advance of forty per cent in freight rates in the east, twenty-eight in the south and thirty-five in the west, has been granted in the mountain Pacific territory of the United States by the interstate commerce commission. An advance of twenty per cent has also been granted in the passenger fares.

A sad accident occurred at Plover, Gloucester county, recently when Miss Margaret St. Coeur was overcome in the water and was drowned before help could reach her. It is supposed that she was seized with a cramp. It was decided that an inquest was unnecessary. St. Coeur is survived by a brother.

A branch of the Great War Veterans Association was organized at Alma recently, and the following officers elected: S. S. Kennedy, president; J. H. Wilbur, first vice-president; B. G. Cooper, second vice-president; Dr. F. Rommel, secretary-treasurer; D. Connor, Chambers and W. Barnister, executive.

It was decided to hold an entertainment for the purpose of raising funds for the association and a committee was appointed with J. H. Wilbur, foreman, to make the necessary arrangements.

M. B. Jones, insurance agent and broker, was struck by an automobile at Moncton, Saturday evening, and thrown into his home when a car, driven by George Hooper, hit him. Francis Walker was in the car with Mr. Hooper. Both men in the car were released pending an investigation. The injured man was picked up unconscious.

On Saturday afternoon an electrical storm passed over Fredericton and a barn belonging to Albert J. Miles, South Devon, was struck. A car and farming machinery were saved but the live stock could not be reached. A milk cow with calf and a driving horse were burned as well as twenty-five tons of hay. The loss is estimated at \$5,000, partly covered by insurance.

Sir Edward Kemp, now minister without portfolio and formerly minister of overseas forces of Canada, has written the finance department returning uncashed all cheques received by him for ministerial salary during the war period. The cheques amount to over \$75,000 and include all payments made him during his term as minister of militia and minister of overseas forces. Sir Henry Drayton, minister of finance, has appropriately acknowledged Sir Edward's generosity.

The Duke of Devonshire arrived at Sydney on the armed yacht Hochelaga on Friday and was greeted by enthusiastic crowds. Saturday morning he left for Louisbourg by special train. He returned to Glace Bay at 2 o'clock and was welcomed by Mayor Forbes. The party had luncheon there and then motored to Sydney, where a guard of honor awaited them. In the evening a ball was held in the club house of the Royal Cape Breton Yacht Squadron. The party attended divine service Sunday morning and the yacht weighed anchor at 1 o'clock.
