## CAPACITY BUSINESS AGAIN AT IMPERIAL

Bill Hart Thrills, Then Makes  
Watchers Cry — Prince of  
Wales and British Tommies  
on the Rhine—Our Navy in  
Surging Seas.

Movie fans would indeed be fastidious if last night's bill at the Imperial did not satisfy them. Besides the especially good Bill Hart western story—good enough for a week's run at the Strand, New York—there was a trip on the Rhine, where the British and French are still patrolling, a grand collection of world news in the Fox Weekly, many of the scenes being Canadian and an inspiring glimpse of the Prince of Wales being hurried and cheered in Australia. The scenes of the British fleet surging through the seas in convoying the Prince were enthralling.

William S. Hart was in one of the best pictures of his career. It is called "The Toll Gate" and is a thrilling and unusually appealing story of the rugged days of the olden West.

Mr. Hart appears as Black Deering, head of a bandit gang, but an honorable man beneath his rough exterior. Deering is anxious to abandon his life of pillaging, but Jordan, his chief lieutenant, urges him to one more hold-up. It is a frame-up and Deering is captured. But he manages to escape and performs several thrilling and hazardous feats in order to elude the sheriff's posse that is trailing him.

Eventually Deering reaches safety in a clearing where the cabin of Mary Brown is located. She proves to be the deserted wife of Jordan. Under her influence, Deering resolves to do the right thing and give himself to the sheriff. As a volunteer, he rescues a detachment of deputies from Jordan and kills the traitor. As a reward, the sheriff allows him his freedom, provided he departs south into Mexico.

Anna Q. Nilsson makes an appealing leading woman. Bill Hart's famous Pinto pony comes in for a good share of the attention and takes a notable part in many of the thrilling scenes. Mr. Hart and Lambert Hillyer are the authors of the story, and the latter directed the picture.

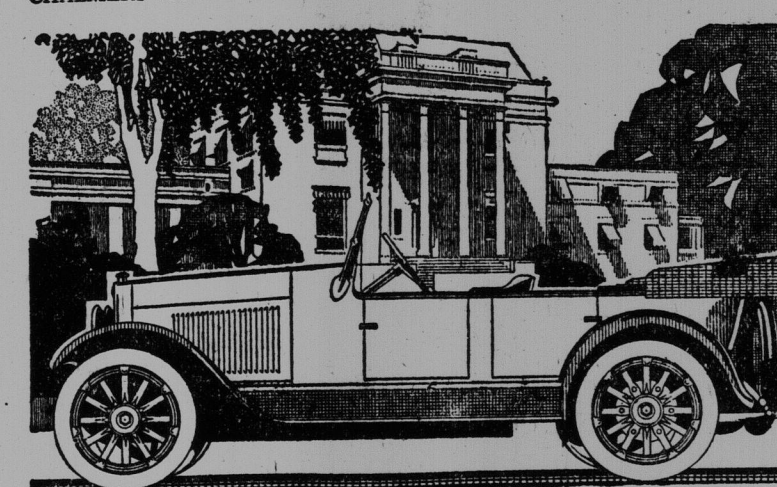

## OLD BUDDHA ENTERS SUMMER PALACE

It is the fourth day of the third moon in one of the twilight years of the Manchu dynasty. The road from Peking to the summer palace is strewn with yellow sand and triangular flags flutter a warning that Tsu Hsi, the Empress Dowager, is coming. The little gray inn where the carter and farmers gossip over their tea are tightly shut. Not a Pekin curd, not a single pedestrian, not a stray duck on the highway. The great old Buddha is on her way from the forbidden city to her beloved summer palace—the imperial fairland created out of the funds that were to have built China a modern navy. The procession is long in passing out of the city gate, in traversing the twelve miles of the granite-paved highway, for there are soldiers, young Manchu princes, the imperial yellow chair of the Empress-Dowager carried by eight bearers, a cavalcade of eunuchs riding behind, resplendent in their embroidered robes, official buttons and feathers, the yellow chairs of the

Emperor Huang Hsu and his wife, the young Empress, the orange chair of his secondary wife, behind them in the red chairs of the court ladies, and everywhere carrying tea things, the yellow satin stool, and precious personal possessions of the Empress-Dowager. After a short rest for tea at the Temple of Imperial Longevity, the procession slowly winds toward the gentle hills, where the jade and yellow porcelain-tiled roofs glisten in the sunlight. The great gate, guarded by bronze lions, swings open, and the old Buddha enters her favorite domain.

Today the summer palace is deserted except for the crows that circle around the tiled roofs, a small army of tattered beggars at the gates, and a few old servants who guide foreign barbarians through the buildings. Twelve years ago the great old Buddha, the last of her dynasty to rule the empire of China, returned to the spirits of her imperial ancestors. A magnificent paper large, filled with the paper figures of servants and court attendants, with paper furniture and food, was burned with solemn ritual that the Empress Dowager might enjoy all the comforts of her summer palace when she reached the Yellow Springs.
