London, April 26—A committee headed by Lord Balfour of Burleigh, which was appointed by Herbert H. Asquith, then premier in 1916, to consider trade and industrial reconstruction after the war, has issued its final report. It generally is against the exclusion, except for a limited period, either of foreign shipping from British ports or of enemy banking, insurance and trading institutions from operating in the United Kingdom.
