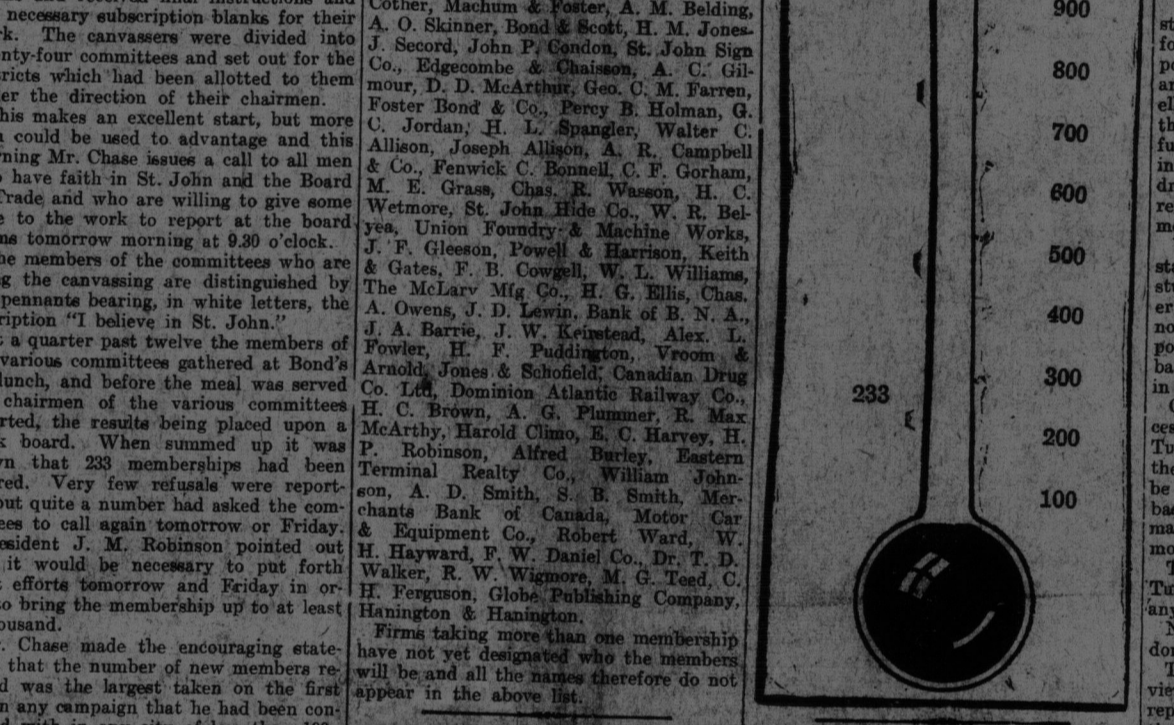

ALLIES' NOTE HANDED TO THE TURKS TODAY

Report of Unrest Among Sultan's Troops at Tchatalja

PEACE STILL EXPECTED

Powers, Seeing Gravity of Situation, All Have Ships Ready—Important Concessions From Turks in Reply to Note Expected

(Canadian Press) London, Jan. 29.—The note drafted by the Balkan delegates was delivered to Rasch Pasha, leader of the Turkish delegation today.

The determining factor impelling the allies in this course of action was the receipt of reports of a large naval force concentrated by the European powers, especially Great Britain, France and Italy, at the entrance to the Dardanelles.

While the clouds are gathering in Constantinople, the astronomers who make study of the European government consider that the general peace of Europe is not in danger. As a proof of this, they point to the fact that Italy has just disbanded her cabinet...
