TWELVE KILLED IN EXPLOSION

Havoc Among Troops and Workmen When Ammunition Factory in Austria Blows Up

Vienna, June 7-Twelve soldiers and workmen were killed and 100 or more injured by an explosion at the Woellersdorf ammunition factory at Weiner Neustadt, an important manufacturing town thirty miles distant from Vienna.

Some 400 pounds of powder exploded with a report heard for thirty miles.
