

He lost no appreciable altitude during the test. One is forced to wonder whether the ultimate high-speed ship, provided the human factor can be protected, will require wings at all for other than ascending and alighting."

Brigadier-General Mitchell, assistant chief of the Army Air Service, later flew the one kilometer course at an official speed of 224.88 miles an hour, a world's speed record. In the preliminary tests, the speed record set by General Mitchell is said to have been exceeded unofficially by Lieutenant Maughan, who is credited with


