

PROCEEDINGS ON PLEA OF NOT GUILTY

Question to
accused:

Q Do you wish to apply for an adjournment on the ground that any of the rules relating to procedure before trial have not been complied with, and that you have been prejudiced thereby, or on the ground that you have not had sufficient opportunity for preparing your defence?

First witness

A MPW.216 dated at Vancouver, BC. 24 August, 1945 relating to the accused.

COURT TO DEFENDING OFFICER.

Q Do you object to this document being received in evidence?

A No, sir.

(DOCUMENT is read, marked "G" signed by the President and attached to the proceedings).

THE DEFENDING OFFICER DECLINES TO CROSS EXAMINE THIS WITNESS.

THE WITNESS WITHDRAWS.

THE PROSECUTOR HAS NO FURTHER WITNESS TO CALL.
