LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

FREDERICTON, April 7.

A bill to authorize special assessments for the streets of St. John was committed.

Mr. Messrs. Seely and Jones strongly commended the extravagance of the Corporation in regard to the streets.

As the expense had already been incurred they reluctantly offered no opposition.

The bill relating to the University passed slightly amended; the bill relating to the St. John Suspension Bridge; the bill to incorporate the Parish of Grand Falls; the bill relating to St. Stephens Church, St. John.

The York County Bill was postponed till the next session of the Legislature.

Hon. Mr. Perley presented the report of the Contingent Committee, which was adopted—expenses \$125.

The supplementary supply bill committee and passed.

The bill to enable municipalities of York township to commission for the widening of streets was passed; the bill to provide for district assessments in parishes containing incorporated towns agreed to; the bill to amend the municipalities of Carleton to make certain bye-laws, postponed; the bill in amendment of Chap. 88, Title 8, revised statutes on taxes was committed and passed; the bill to protect persons travelling from injury by trains was agreed to.

A Member Resigns—Four New Members Sworn In.

Hon. Mr. Young presented a message from Lieut. Governor containing the resignation of Hon. Charles Harrison.

Bills relating to land surveys and surveys of land, and to special assessment Eastern side harbor St. John, were committed and passed.

HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY—Continued from First Edition.

The House, being summoned at a quarter past 12, in the usual form, attended His Honor the Lieut. Governor in the Legislative Council Chamber, and having attended and returned again, the Speaker announced that while there His Honor had delivered the following Speech:

Mr. President and Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council:
Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly:
The unremitting attention which you have given to your Legislative duties commands my hearty acknowledgments.

The Act which you have passed in aid of the construction of railways in the Province is one under the operation of which I have every reason to hope that the railway freedom from arrest, at the same time afford a more speedy and efficacious remedy to the creditor than the remedy of his debts has been in the past been within his reach.

Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly:
I thank you for the supplies which you have granted for the public service. I will be my duty, aided by my Council, to apply with economy the funds thus placed at my disposal.

Mr. President and Gentlemen of the Legislative Council:
I congratulate you on the termination of your labors. You will, I am sure, on your return to your respective localities, use your influence to promote mutual good feeling among all classes, and I earnestly hope that it will please Providence to continue the many blessings we now enjoy.
