One of Canada's outstanding newspaper men passed away Sunday, with the death of Mr. William J. Douglas, General Manager of The Toronto Mail and Empire. For 42 years the late Mr. Douglas had been associated with this paper, and in those years played a very important part in the development of Canadian journalism.

He had reached his 73rd year. In 1877 Mr. Douglas came to Toronto from Milwaukee at the behest of the late Mr. John R. Gordon, who had purchased The Mail in that year, and at once took active part in the development of the Toronto daily. Until the amalgamation of The Mail and The Empire, which
