

Columbia, 1871. Created a Q.C., 1863. Was a mem. of Ex. Council, Can., and Solicitor General for U.C. from Dec., 1863 to Jan., 1864. Accompanied Hon. W. Macdougall, C.B., to the North West, as Attorney General, 1869. An unsuccessful candidate for South Leeds in Can. Assembly at g.e., 1861, and for same seat, in House of Commons, at g.e., 1867. Sat for South Leeds in Can. Assembly, from g.e., 1863, until Jan., 1864, when defeated. First returned to Commons at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Brockville, Ont.*

RICHARD, EDOUARD, *B.C.L.* [*Megantic.*]

Second son of Louis Richard, Esq., of Stanfold, Arthabaska, P.Q., by Hermine Prince; and nephew of the late Right Rev. Dr. Prince, Bishop of St. Hyacinthe. B. at Princeville, P.Q., 1844. Ed. at Nicolet College, and at McGill College, Montreal, where he obtained degree of B.C.L. Unmarried. Called to the Bar, L.C., 1868. A mem. of the law firm of Laurier & Richard. First returned to Parlt., for present seat, at last g.e. A Liberal and a Protectionist.—*Princeville, P.Q.*
