Bd. of Education. He is the author of a practical treatise on the office and duties of Coroners, a work which has passed into three editions. While in private life he was a Lib. Con. in politics, and held the chairmanship of the Barrie Lib. Con. Assn. He was apptd. Junior Judge, Co. of Simcoe, Sept. 27, 1883. He is a mem. of the Ch. of Eng., and m. BRADFORD, Henry Martin, educationist, was b. in London, Eng., 1865. Ed. at the city of London Sch., and at St. John's Coll., Cambridge (M.A., foundation scholar, and 21st wrangler, 1886), he came to Can., and was for a time head master of a sch. in Halifax. He had also considerable experience in army "coaching," placing pupils in the Brit. army, both through Sandhurst and through the Can. militia. While in Halifax, he edited with success, *Our Society*, a society paper. He was appointed Head Master of the Coll. Sch., Windsor, N.S., Oct., 1892; is also an exam. in Math. Physics at King's Coll. Mr. B. has completely reorganized the Coll. Sch. with a staff of Eng. Univ. men, and brought it up to the first rank of Can. schs. He edits *The Windsorian*, a sch. mag., and is a mem. of the Ch. of Eng.—*Collegiate School, Windsor, N.S.; New Oxford and Cambridge Club, Pall Mall, London, Eng.*

BRAINERD, Thomas Chalmers, physician, is the s. of the late Rev. Thos. Brainerd, D.D., of Philadelphia, Pa., by his wife Mary, dau. of the late Judge Danl. Whiting, of Albany, N.Y. B. in Philadelphia

Sept. 27, 1837, he was ed. at Yale Coll. (class of 1859), and graduated M.D. at Jefferson Med. Coll., Philadelphia. He entered the regular army of the U. S. as Asst. Surgeon, and received two brevets for his services during the war of the Confederacy. Resigned from the army to take position as Supt. of Lafin & Rand Powder Co. In 1876 removed to Can. and became Presdt. of Hamilton Powder Co. He is also Presdt. of the Dom. Cartridge Co., and of the St. Henri Chemical Co., the former of which was incorporated 1890, and the latter 1894. Among other offices held by him is that of Treas. of the Quebec Fish and Game Protection Club. He became an Assoc. of the Can. Soc. of C. E., 1889. Dr. B. is a mem. of the Presb. Ch. He m. 1865, Miss Mari Lafin Boies of Saugerties, N.Y.—*171 Drummond St., Montreal.*

BRAY, John Lang, physician, is the s. of the late Wm. Bray, R.N., by his wife Eliza, dau. of the late John Lang, of Plymouth, Eng. B. at Kingston, Ont., 1841, he was ed. at the London Dist. Grammar Sch., and graduated M.D. at Queen's Univ., Kingston, 1863. Obtaining a provincial license the same year, he commenced to practise in Chatham, and has been a continuous resident of that town for over 30 yrs. He is a mem. of the med. staff of the St. Joseph's and the Public Genl. Hospitals, Surgeon to the G. T. Ry., the C. P. Ry., the Erie and Huron Rys., Gaol Physician, a coroner for Kent, has sat in the Town and County Councils, and has been Presdt. of the Common Sch. Bd., and a mem. of the Coll. Inst. Bd. The eminent position he has attained in his profession is attested by the hearty and repeated marks of favor which have been conferred upon him. He is a mem. of the Am. Med. Assn., and has held the Presidency of the Chatham Med. Soc., and of the Western and St. Clair Med. Assn. Elected to the Med. Council of Ont. 1880, he has been re-elected thereto
