Page 3, line 18.—After ("whatsoever") insert ("and intoxicating liquor or fluid; as also opium and any preparation thereof, whether liquid or solid; and any other intoximating drug or substance, and tobacco or tea mixed or compounded or impregnated with opium or with other intoxicating drug or substance, and whether the same or any of them be liquid or solid.")

And the said amendment being read a second time was agreed to. On motion of the Honorable Mr. Scott, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Chaffers,

it was

Ordered, That the said Bill, as amended, be read a third time presently. The said Bill, as amended, was then read a third time accordingly.

The question was put whether this Bill, as amended, shall pass !

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons, and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill with an amendment, to which they desire their concurrence.

The House, according to Order, was adjourned during pleasure, and put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill intituled: "An Act to provide for the construction of the Canadian Pacific Railway."

After some time the House was resumed, and

The Honorable Mr. Kaulbach, from the said Committee, reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same to the House without any amendment.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Scott, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Letellier de

St. Just, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be read a third time presently.

The coad Bill was then read a third time accordingly.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

Is was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons, and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, without any amendment.

The House, according to Order, was adjourned during pleasure, and again put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill intituled: "An Act to amend the Act respecting "the Trinity House and Harbor Commissioners of Montreal."
