C A P. XXXI.

An Act for the Encouragement of the Fisheries carried on from *Great Britain*, *Ireland*, and the *British* Dominions in *Europe*, and for fecuring the Return of the Fishermen, Sailors, and others employed in the faid Fisheries, to the Ports thereof, at the End of the Fishing Season.



BEREAS the Filheries carried on by his Preamble. Dajelly's Subjects of Great Britain and of the British Dominions in Europe have been found to be the best Murseries for able and experienced Seamen, always ready to man the Royal Mavy when Dc-

cations require; and it is therefore of the higheft national Importance to give all due Encouragement to the faid Filherles, and to endeavour to fecure the annual Return of the Filhermen, Sailors, and others employed therein, to the Ports of Great Britain, and of His Gaiefty's Dominions before mentioned, at the End of every filhing Seafon: Now, in order to promote these great and impor-
