OAKVILLE — Mayor McLean Anderson has made an appeal to the board of governors of the new Halton-Peel Community College to have the institution located in Oakville.

The mayor, in an appearance before the board at a meeting in Cooksville last week, proposed three possible sites for the college, the prime one being the John Wallace estate on the Seventh Line.

The sites will be considered along with others, and it is understood it will be some time before a definite decision is made.

English Classes Too Successful For Park Royal Minister's Schedule

CLARKSON — With the basic desire to be able to communicate with fellow man, about 160 newly-arrived immigrants are now taking basic English courses in Toronto Township.

But this present curriculum now set up as night classes in two schools has reached its present form through what appears to be a process of elimination.

More than a year ago, several people who knew

only enough English to get by on, approached Rev. G. R. Bradford of Park Royal Bible Church on Truscott dr. in Clarkson.

They asked for tutoring in small groups in their home. They did not want to be swamped in the mass of large classes.

Rev. Bradford agreed. He went to their homes and with material supplied by the Dept. of Provincial Secretary and Citizenship in Toronto, he began to open up a new world for them.

The word spread. And other people came to ask his help. And again he agreed.

But Mr. Bradford had major responsibilities within his church and the inevitable conflict finally materialized. He had only 24 hours in the day, and the day came when 24 just was not enough.

Although he was forced to suspend his instructions, he is anxiously awaiting his opportunity to get them going again.

Mr. Bradford's efforts had started with a single group of five. They did not want English in a word by word vocabulary, but in phrases.

They did not want syllables. They wanted conversations. And they were willing to accept the stumbling blocks that lay in the road to communicate.

But the heaviest stumbling block of all for the majority of these people is the very environment they are forced into when coming to a new country. Many have to work on a shift basis, thereby eliminating the possibility of establishing a schedule.

The Toronto Township Board of Education attempted to set up courses in blueprint reading, electronics, machine shop and weld-

ing. And they offered to teach them in Italian. One person registered.

And then they set up night courses in basic English. To make it easier, they offered to hold them in two different schools. Thomas L. Kennedy on Hurontario and Gordon Graydon Memorial on Ogden ave. Somehow, with 160 attending the stumbling blocks were overcome.

HALF LOAD LIMITS-1967

Half load limits, under Section 54, Subsections 4, 5 and 6, of the Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O., are in effect on all County Roads in the County of Peel from March 1st, to April 30th, 1967, except the following—

1. Malton Airport Road from York-Peel Boundary north to Highway No. 9.
2. Derry Road from York-Peel Boundary west to the Mississauga Road.
3. Dixie Road from Highway No. 2 north to Highway No. 7.
4. Steeles Avenue from Malton Airport Road west to Highway No. 10.
5. Cawfira Road from Highway No. 2 north to Burnhamthorpe Road.
6. Mississauga Road from Highway No. 2 to Derry Road.
7. Springbank Road from the Queen Elizabeth Way north to Mississauga Road.
8. County Road No. 18, in the Township of Toronto, from the Queen Elizabeth Way to Highway No. 5.
9. Brampton By-Pass.
10. County Road No. 9 from Victoria east to York-Peel Boundary.
