the other reserves. As Mr. Tityfatrick has had a great deal of Experience among Indians and knows cheir character, I think this matter worth of serious consideration. I have instructed him to put a stop to those dances, by stoping the issue of rations. I am satisfied from information received that there is a large number of the hidians from this agency, camped somewhere on the Red DEEr Niver and that they have a large number of horses and guns, would it cherefore not be well to have this camp broken up and the hidians sent back to theor reserves. I think it would also be advisable to have small parties of 7 or 10 police scouts scattered through the different parts of the country, to guard against small war parties, doing any depredations and would in a measure intimidate the Indians from making trouble, for if there is any trouble next spring I do not auticipate there will be a general uprising among all the Indians but that there will be some small was parties from the different defendations Teserves, who would commit depredations through the country and then go south over the times I have the honor tobe
