Sir,-

With reference to your letter of the 21st ultimo, No. 473, I beg to enclose herewith a blue print plan showing the lands at Brocket Station in the Peigan Indian Reserve which have been purchased from the Canadian Pacific Railway. The lands consist of the blocks lettered A,B,C, and D as shown on the plan.

You should allow not trespass on these lands or on any other part of the reserve.

If Mr. Megginson and his associates desire to erect a flour mill on any part of the said lands or reserve, they should make an application through you for the land they require, stating the amount they are willing to pay for the same or the annual rental if they desire a lease.

You should then forward the application with your report to the Department for its consideration and you will be then further advised. In the meantime you will please not allow any trespass on the reserve as above instructed.
