- 1. Concerning above, may I request that the sum of thirty eight hundred and fifty dollars (\$3850.00) be forwarded by The Indian Affairs Branch to this Detachment on or before July 1st,1946. This amount which consists of \$1100.00 for Churchill and \$2750.00 for the Nelson River Agencies will cover payment to Churchill and York Factory Bands. As there are no Banks at this point may arrangements be made, as has been done in previous years, that The Royal Bank of Canada at The Pas, Manitoba, send the total amount in one dollar bills.
- I am expecting to make payment of treaty at Gillam on July 5th and 6th, travelling from Churchill via Gas Car. Concluding payment at this point, as prearranged with Dr Yule of The Pas, travel will be continued by Gas Car to Ilford. At this point on July 8th it will be necessary to travel by Plane transport to York Factory and Shammattawa. It is expected that the Treaty Party which will consist of two members of the Force, an Interpreter a doctor and nurse will stop over at York Factory for four days and Shammattawa three days, returning to Ilford on July 15th.
- a. It is expected that breaty will be paid to the Churchill Band shortly after returning off the above trip. It will ne necessary to obtain services of an Aircraft for travel into buck Lake. The Hudson's Bay representive this point is unable to supply an approximate date as to when freight will be flown into buck Lake, but states that it should be shortly after ice break-up. The trip to North River another encampment of the Churchill Band will be made via canoe. The Treaty party in this instance will consist of two members of the Porce, an Interpreter and a loctor.
- accompany the Treaty Party at Gillam, York Pactory and Shanmattawa but will be unable to supply his services on treaty payment in the Churchill Agency. In view of this fact it is requested that a Doctor be engaged to make the trips into luck lake and North River Bands of the Churchill Agency.
- be granted for the treaty party to proceed to York Factory and Shammattawa on July 8th, and to luck Lake (date unknown) by Air Transport. It is not known what Plane service will be available, so it is suggested that arrangements in this respect be concluded linnipeg.
