Reverend Sir,-

With reference to the admission of several children from the Caughnawaga Reserve to the Spanish Industrial School, I beg to say that Agent Brosseau has forwarded applications and certificates of health for the admission of 7 girls and 15 boys. The Principal informs the Department that no accommodation can be provided for the girls at present. The Department has, however, decided to place the following boys in this school, - James Alfred, Michel Skye, Howard Stacey, Joseph Montour, Francis Laborne, Resime Laborne, Mitchel Laborne, Louis Depeau, Frank Beauvais, David Beauvais, William Rice, Arthur Rice (Achille), Frank Pinsonnault, Ignace Mailloux and Joseph Mailloux.

The Department is instructing Constable Two-axe to have these boys at the Windsor Street Station on Tuesday December 9th at 8 P.M. The Department feels certain that you will give the constable any assistance possible in preparing these boys to go to Spanish and that you will see that he is at the Windsor Street Station at the time mentioned above.
