Circular.

Sir,

I have the honor to refer you to my Circular of the 1<sup>st</sup> instant, of even number, which amended my circular of 13<sup>th</sup> April last, of even number, relative to accepting whole or unbroken packages of tea, tobacco, sugar, bacon &c.; and unbroken pieces of prints, winey, or woollen goods; in order to draw attention to a matter, considered of too great importance to be left to be inferred; viz; that in case of weighing or measuring, as directed in circular of 1<sup>st</sup> instant, any discrepancy should be found to exist between the actual and invoiced quantities, it will become your duty to measure every package or piece of goods in the consignment, in part of which an error has been discovered to exist.
