SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE

Summary of Evidence in the case of B 67964 Corporal John George Moody,  
8 Cdn Recce Regt (14CH).

The accused is informed of his rights.

The Commanding Officer directs that the evidence be taken on oath.

FIRST WITNESS (For the Prosecution) L 2460 Cpl. Laird, G.B., 8 Cdn Recce  
Regt (14CH), having been duly sworn, states:-

At 2245 hrs on the 2nd Oct 1943, I called the roll, as I was  
troop orderly cpl. Cpl. Moody was not in and I marked him absent.

The accused declines to cross examine the witness.

SECOND WITNESS (For the Prosecution) L 13262 Sgt. Rutter, T.A., having  
been duly sworn, states:-

On the 3rd of Oct 1943, I was Troop orderly Sgt. At 1045 hrs  
on Sunday 3rd, Cpl. Moody reported in to me. I placed him under  
open arrest, as he was A.W.L.

The accused declines to cross examine the witness.

THIRD WITNESS (For the Prosecution) L 53295 Tpr. Smith, D.E., having  
been duly sworn, states:-

On the morning of Oct 7, I was on charge for being A.W.L. and  
for being drunk, at the C.O.'s Orderly Room. I was asked if I was  
in at 2230 hrs the night before, and I said I didn't know. I went  
into Worthing Central about 1900 hrs, and I was drinking with Tpr.  
Muirhead. At 2150 hrs I went to the station. I passed out cold  
and don't remember anything at all until I woke at a station (Goring  
I believe) and started walking until I hit an A.A. post, where I got  
directions. After about 3 hours, I arrived in camp at 0430 hrs and  
went to bed.

The accused declines to cross examine the witness.

FOURTH WITNESS (For the Prosecution) L 54818 Tpr. Checkow, F.,  
having been duly sworn, states:-

I came to West Worthing at 1045 hrs 6 Oct and met Tpr. Smith.  
He was drunk, so Mr. Haley and I put him on the train and took him  
off again at Goring stn. Mr. Haley told me to take him home, but  
as he was unable to walk, we left him on a bench at the station, and  
walked home. It took us about 20 minutes and I arrived in at 0015 hrs  
the 7th.

Q. What time were you at the station? The last train leaves at 10.10.  
A. The train that was supposed to be in at 10.10 didn't come. I had  
stopped at London or somewhere and the station man told us to wait for  
the next train at 2245hrs.

FIFTH WITNESS (For the Prosecution) Capt. C.M. Woods, having been duly  
sworn, states:-

I am adjutant of the 8 Cdn Recce Regt (14CH). At C.O.'s Orderly  
Room on the 7th Oct 1943, during the hearing of the case against  
a Trooper Smith D.E., John George Moody gave evidence to the effect  
that he had personally checked Trooper Smith into his quarters. The  
C.O. doubted his word, and in my presence he administered the oath
