Kindly refer to previous correspondence relative to the above Reserve, particularly Surrenders No. 799 and No. 1362.

In the first surrender certain specified areas were reserved by the Indians for their own use, as shown on Plan B.C. 210, while in the later surrender the entire Northern part of the Reserve was surrendered without any reservations, so far as I Know.

I should, therefore, appreciate receiving from you, three copies of B.C. Plan 210, showing distinctly the exact areas reserved as well as the area under the Surrender No. 1362, with reservations, if any, clearly defined.

Kindly let me have this as soon as possible as the operators do not wish to trespass on reserved areas and the plan I have is so badly worn that it is difficult to read.
