

BRONCHIAL COUGH, or Bronchitis. An inflammation of the lining membrane of the large bronchial tubes, situated just below the collar bone. The cough is incessant, for a day or two it will be dry and hard, after two or three days the cough will bring up frothy, slimy tissues from the lungs. There is considerable fever and a dragging soreness across the upper part of the chest.

TREATMENT: Apply mustard poultices across the chest mornings and nights, keeping on only a few minutes, or apply Dr. Pierce's (Mentha) Soothaline.
