DEMONSTRATIVE ADJECTIVE.

23. The demonstrative adjective is :

Singular.		Plural.	
M.	M.	F.	M. and F.
Before a consonant.	Before a vowel.		

CE, CET, CETTE, *this, that.* CES, *these, those.*

CET is used before a vowel or *h* mute.

Ce livre, ces livres, *this or that book, these or those books.*
cet homme, ces hommes, *this man, these men.*
cette maison, ces maisons, *that house, those houses.*

The particles *-ci (here)* and *-là (there)* are added after the noun, when it is necessary to distinguish between *this* and *that*, *these* and *those* :

ce pain-ci et ce pain-là, *this bread and that bread.*
ces fleurs-ci et ces fleurs-là, *these flowers and those flowers.*
