ON ROADS AND OTHER INTERNAL COMMUNICATIONS.

That, as foon as, between the River Ouelle and Kamouraska, Third Report, there shall have been conceded in the rear of the old Settlements not less than one hundred lots of the said land to actual settlers, 2d Feb. 1829. It shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government for the time being, to cause the proper Surveys to be made for tracing, making and opening a Road of communication to and from such new settlements, and that there be appropriated for this purpose, a Sum not exceeding Five hundred Pounds.

That, as foon as, in the rear of the old Settlements of L'Islet, there shall have been conceded not less than one hundred lots of the said land to actual settlers, it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government for the time being, to cause the proper Surveys to be made for tracing, making and opening a Road of communication to and from such new Settlements; and that there be appropriated for this purpose a sum not exceeding Five hundred Pounds.

That, as foon as, in the rear of the Bras St. Nicolas in the County of Devon, there shall have been conceded not less than one hundred lots of the said land to actual settlers, it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government, for the time being, to cause the proper Surveys to be made for tracing and opening a Road of communication to and from such new settlements, and that there be appropriated for this purpose a sum not exceeding Five hundred Pounds.

That, as soon as, in the rear of the old Settlements of La Rivière du Sud there shall have been conceded not less than one hundred lots of the said land to actual settlers, it shall be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Person administering the Government for the time being, to cause the proper Surveys to be made for tracing, making and opening a Road of communication to and from such new Settlements, and that there be appropriated for this purpose a Sum not exceeding Five hundred Pounds.

That, as foon as, there shall have been conceded not less than one hundred lots of the Crown Lands lying between the
