I cannot too earnestly entreat our friends to exert themselves to procure a more suitable building for the boys—the present one is wanting in many respects—badly drained, badly ventilated—difficult to heat and without proper accommodation to seperate the sick children from those who are well.

In conclusion I wish to express my thanks to the lady manager, matron and all others connected with the Home, for their unceasing kindness and attention at all times.
