ANOTHER PRIZE PRESENTED

(Goderich Star).

On the evening of April 13th, the directors and officers of the Goderich Industrial Exhibition, together with a few of their friends, met in the Union Hotel, to enjoy a couple of hours in pleasant social intercourse. There was also a guest from Peterborough present in the person of Mr. H. P. Cowan, editor of Farm and Dairy, who has come to make a presentation to Mr. C. Lathwaite, who last year won fourth prize in District No. 3, in the prize farms competition held during the Ontario Fair at Farm and Dairy. The programme was arranged with the following toasts, presided over by Mr. C. Lathwaite, Dr. C. E. Porter: "The King," "Our Agricultural Society and its interests," responded to by C. A. Bell, J. S. Bell, Dr. C. E. Porter, and Mr. Cowan. The first three gentlemen combined their remarks to local conditions, while the address by Mr. C. Lathwaite was directed entirely with the works of agriculture in the various societies throughout Ontario. The "Horticultural and Fruit" question was responded to by Messrs. Lane and Hamilton, in 10 minute instructive addresses. "Why I like the Farm," was supported by Messrs. H. R. Hengerveld and J. J. Golderich. At the request of Mr. Lathwaite, the meeting christened his fine herd of dairy cattle, "The Goderich Jersey Herd of Maple Leaf Farm." The cup awarded to Mr. Lathwaite has been placed on exhibition at the Star office.

EXTRACTS FROM "DOES DRAINAGE PAY?"

R. H. McCurdy, Vienna, Elgin: "Last fall I drained two acres that formerly was field ground. They were low spots in a field. Cost \$17.50 an acre. This year I had 40 bushels of what I want an acre on them, while the higher ground only 30 bushels. The drains more than paid for 30 bushels was this one crop. The whole was worth \$10.00. As those spots would grow nothing before."

J. W. McKim, Caledon, Peat: "I have drained some two acres that have been dry since we had to sow around them even in a dry spring. This year they were well and ready to sow. I cannot compare dates, as I never could sow them before."

"This year (1909) I have had a heavy rain on drained and on undrained land. The drained land yielded 15 bushels more an acre than the undrained, and twice as much straw."

Peter W. Scott, Belgrave, Huron: "The lowest field on my farm has been on drained land and this spring it was the driest field and ready to cultivate the earliest. I consider in a year like this thorough drainage doubles the value of land for cultivation."

Samuel Brock, Collingwood, Simcoe: "We put down some 17.00 acres of tile drains last fall, according to your plan. Everything worked out perfectly. The cost was \$97.50 the greater part of the land drained had never been, but this year we on account of being wet, but this year we have had some of the best crops of the year. It also carries better pasture. We would not think of working undrained land any more."

"We cannot say too much in praise of the drainage work of your department, as we have done considerable tile draining before and therefore know the advantage of your system."
