

## CHAPTER 96.

### An Act to authorize the sale of the old Presbyterian Meeting House, at Windsor.

[Passed the 31st day of March, 1856.]

## SECTION

## SECTION

3. Purchase money—how disposed of.

Be it enacted by the governor, council, and assembly as follows :

1. A majority of the members of the presbyterian congregation, at Windsor, in the county of Hants, present at a meeting held after at least ten days' notice of the time and place of holding such meeting being given by public intimation to the said congregation, during or immediately after divine service, may authorize and direct the trustees of the congregation for the time being to sell and convey in fee simple the said lot of land with the building thereon, being the lot of land on which the old presbyterian meeting house now stands, and which was by deed dated the tenth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten, and duly registered in the office of the registry of deeds, at Windsor, in book eight, page four hundred and eighteen, conveyed by one James Robertson to Robert McHefey, John McLatchy, Nathaniel Jenkins, Lodowick Hunter, and Robert Ferguson, and to the survivor of them, and the heirs of such survivor, in trust and for certain uses and purposes in said deed specifically set forth.

Sale—how authorized, &c.

2. The said conveyance shall not affect the rights of the said James Robertson, his heirs and assigns, in and to a certain road from the highway across the north-western end of said lot to his other land, nor any liabilities of the said congregation, or their assigns, in reference to the repairing of the fences upon the said lot as provided in said deed from James Robertson to Robert McHefey and others.

Rights not affected.

3. After deducting from the purchase money the charges attending such sale the balance shall be held by the trustees to and for the use of said congregation.
