III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforefuld, That it shall and may be lawful for any one of his Majelty's Justices of the Peace, upon the oath of any one credible witness, to hear and determine the matter in complaint, and on conviction under his hand and feal, to cause to be levied of the goods and chattels of such offender or offenders as are herein before mentioned, the fum of five pounds for the first offence, and double the fum for every subsequent offence, committed contrary to the intention of this Act, or in default of payment, to commit the offender to the common gaol of the Diffriel for one month.

IV And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, That one half of to be diffributed every fine levieu, or to be levied, by virtue of this Act, shall be given to the informer, and the other half shall be paid into the hands of his Majesty's Receiver General, to anu for the public uses of this Province.
