RE. SCOUT RALLY AND CIVICUS

Editor Daily Courier,

Sir,—In reply to "Civics," and in fairness to the Brantford Headquarters Patrol of Scouts, I beg to make the following statement regarding the competition for the Challenge Shield. This shield was given for the most efficient troop of patrol of scouts on parade.

The judges were as follows: H. G. Hammond, Assistant Commissioner for Ontario, Commissioner Garfield Gibson of Ingersoll, Commissioner C. W. Heming, Hamilton; Commissioner C. B. Robinson, Paris; Capt. Colquhoun, Brantford and Scoutmaster Houten of Hamilton.

We regret that the above gentlemen, even although they are considered authorities in scouting throughout Ontario, lacked the knowledge of what efficient scoutcraft really is (according to "Civics," who in his own opinion at least has so much).

The final judgment was awarded for the following reasons: the Headquarters Patrol, which came first, had given six distinct and perfect displays of scoutcraft, including Royal Life Saving Society, firemen, ambulance, signalling, compass direction and skirmishing signal work. The next best troop in line had only given three displays. The Headquarters Patrol was wearing 280 efficiency badges, while the greatest number worn by any other troop was 250.

This excellent showing made by ten Scouts compared so favorably with any troop on parade, whose numbers ran from twenty to thirty—that the unanimous decision in favor of the Headquarters Patrol was quickly and justly given. Commissioner Gibson of Ingersoll and the judges agreeing that its work, appearance and scoutcraft was perfect and unequalled in quality or quantity.

If the gentleman who is the Scout-like author of the effusion signed "Civics" had used the non-deplorable "officials," it would doubtless have been better understood and appreciated, as he is known to the local troops despite his pen name.
