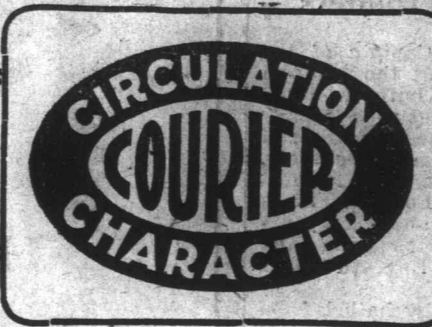

## TRESSPASSING TOO COMMON

**Coroner's Jury Recommends That Railway Companies Take Action**

"The present state of affairs is all too prevalent the public has very little respect for trespass signs, and a more rigid prosecution would have greater effect, and prevent many accidents and deaths."

Coroner Cassette thus addressed the jury last night at the inquest into the death of the foreigner killed on the Grand Trunk tracks on Saturday night. It appears that the real name of the deceased is not Dubock, but Karol Krupier, which may be translated into Charles Cooper.

The jury returned a verdict to the effect that the deceased came to his death while trespassing upon the Grand Trunk property, and that while no blame is attached to the railway company, the erection of more trespassing signs and the adoption of more strenuous measures might prevent similar accidents.

Three witnesses only were called, Dr. W. D. Why, to give testimony as to the man's death in the hospital; Thomas Yapp, a G.T.R. yardman, who stated that Krupier was trespassing when struck by the train, and Ludwig Blach, brother-in-law of the deceased, who says the latter less than two hours before the accident. He denied that Krupier was intoxicated.

## CZERNIN WILFULLY MISINTERPRETS

**Placed Wrong Construction on Utterances of French Premier**

Paris, April 3.—"Czernin lied."

This is all Premier Clemenceau had to say when told today of the statement of Count Czernin that he had inquired through an intermediary whether Austria-Hungary was ready to negotiate and if so on what basis. The premier departed from Paris for the front this morning, and learned of Count Czernin's speech on his arrival there.

Washington, April 3.—Count Czernin's statement that France had suggested peace discussions with Austria-Hungary was characterized by officials here today as the beginning of a new German peace offensive with the Austro-Hungarian foreign minister acting at Germany's behest.

The speech of Count Czernin, it was declared, was a political manoeuvre designed to spread the impression that the Allies were fighting solely to recover Alsace-Lorraine. The peace, they said, was timed to follow the breakdown of the Austro-Hungarian offensive. Any Teutonic suggestions that the time for peace discussions is near at hand will find nothing but a negative response in America.

At the State Department it was made clear today that officials of this government do not believe the present great engagement in Europe will result in any weakening either at the capitals or among the people of the nations at war, and that Premier Clemenceau had indicated a willingness to discuss peace was not given credit. It was believed that a willful misinterpretation had been given to some statement of the French premier for the purpose of securing a favorable reaction in France and her co-belligerents.

Count Czernin's declaration that Austria-Hungary almost was on the point of beginning peace negotiations with the Entente was branded by officials as false. Officials characterized the foreign minister's speech as a "feeler," which probably would be followed by some declaration or announcement in Germany.

## HONOR HELLO GIRLS

London, April 4.—Telephone girls who volunteered for service during the recent London Air raids, were awarded a special badge of honor by the government. It is a round badge surmounted by a crown, and bears the words "London Telephone Service. Air Raids," followed by a Latin motto meaning "Love of country leads them."
