
AN OTTAWA PRIEST PLANS A VAST STRUCTURE FOR NEW YORK.

will Be the Greatest Church in the Whole World and Is Designed to Hold From Sixty to Seventy Thousand Peopre-A Gorgeous Interior, of Which the Mosaics Will Cost Millions-Cathedral of Nova Sancta Sophia.

Plans are under consideration by a religious community in New York City for a sacred building of an unusual character. The approved drawings contemplate an edifice more magnificent than the world-famous St. Sophia of Constantinople, more capacious than St. Peter's of Rome. The latter bolds 50,000 people; the drawings for the New York structure are on a scale calculated for between 60,000 and 70,000. Rev. Father J. Bouillon, Canon of the Roman Catholic Cathedral of Ottawa, Canada, is the designer. He calls the new hurch Nova Sancta Sophia.

The dome, in Mosaics, will sit like resplendent crown upon a vista of delicate columns of the rarest marbles and brilliant reproductions of the greatest works of the old masters in Rome. The costly character of the Mosaics may be realized when it is remembered that a single reproduction, only 15 by 30 feet in size, will average an outlay of \$100,000; and the whole of the church is to be covered with them. All the splendor of this dazzling interior will be brought out by the uninterrupted light of tier upon tier of windows rising 450 feet to the dome. The ast tier of windows are to be reared 50 feet nearer heaven than the cross on the dome of St. Peter's.

The top of the dome somewhat reembles that of St. Peter's, but over it there is a gallery like that of the dome of the Invalides at Paris. But it is adorned, in the case of Nova Sancta Sophia with the four apocalyptical animals. The top of the dome is finished with a globe having the shape of a ciborium resting on a ground of cherubims, the whole being surmounted by the cross. The beauty of the interior is re-

at a glance. The entrance view of the whole church, from the floor to the top of the dome, something nowhere clse seen except at St. Sophia in Constantinople and the Rotunda in

All the pictures are to be reproduc-Mosaic of the masterpieces The columns throughout the church of rare marbles, stand around the chapels so as to leave a clear view from each chapel of the ntire building. The ceiling of each f the chapels is 130 feet from the pavement. Words convey but a faint impression of the perfect beauty when completed in all the splendor of its ornamentation and in its mag-The brightness of its coloring, the blending and harmonizing of the tints and hues of the Mosaics and pillars, and the atnospheric effects, can scarcely be depicted on paper. If St. Sophia, of Constantinople, remains one of the vonders of the Old World, Nova Sancta Sophia will be the greatest wonder of the New, and the most fit, mposing and beautiful temple ever reared to the majesty of the Divine Master by His devout servants

Reform in Naval Nomenclature. Lord Selborne, first lord of the British admiralty, has decided to abandon the old practice of going to heathen mythology for names of new warships, and in future all vessels will be named after the countries, counties and towns. The names of the two 18,000 on battleships immediately to be laid down have just been announced. They are New Zealand and Hindustan. There are already among battleships a Dominion, a Commonwealth, a London and an Edinburgh, and it is said that the two new armored cruisers will be named Natal and Newfoundland. The idea of the admiralty is to interest countries, counties and towns in the ships that bear their names and by this way to encourage re-cruiting for the navy. Already six-teen cruisers have been called after

The New Judge's Career.

John James Maclaren, K.C., new Appeal Judge, is a son of the late John Maclaren, a native of Calander, Scotland. He was born Lachute, P.Q., in 1842. He obtained the degree of B.A. at Victoria University, taking the Prince of Wales gold medal in 1862; M. A., 1866; LL.B., 1868; LL.D., 1888, and graduated B.C.L. at McGill University in 1868. Te obtained his D. C. course in 1888. The Row Judge began practice in 1868 Montreal, being a partner for a time of N. W. Trenholme, K. C. Subsaqueatly he was head of the firm of Maclaren, Leet & Smith. He was called to the Ontario Bar in 1884, cceded Mr. Justice Rose in the longestablished firm of Rose, Macdonald, Merritt & Shepley. He was created a Q.C. by the Quebec Government in 1878 and by the Ontario Government in 1890. He was Secretary of the British and American joint commission on Hudson Bay claims, 1867 to 1869, and a member of the comnission on the code of civil procedare of Quebec in 1887. Mr. Maclaren is a member of the governing bodies of many educational institutions. flis publications include "Roman Law in English Jurisprudence,' 'Bills, Notes and Checks' and Banks and Banking." He has atvays been an active worker in religious, educational and temperance movements, and is Chairman of the Executive of the Dominion Prohibition Alliance. In 1895 he represented Ontario before the Imperial Privy Council in the appeal from the deision of the Supreme Court of Canda in reference to the Provincial power to grant prohibition. He reresented the Liberals of Huntingon in the Legislature of Quebec dur ng the term following the election of 1874, and was subsequently President of the Montreal Young Men's


## How Men Are Shot.
