If the department would prohibit the setting of smelt nets on the flats where bass abound and allow them only in the channel we doubt not that very few small bass would be taken. Of course our local warden was but following his instructions. but we think he should have entered a pro-test in favor of those fishermen had were following the reqirements of the law by returning small bass to the water. 
