TRIBE OF 2,000 CHOSE DEATH

St. Petersburg, June 18.—One of the most terrible stories of nomadic vicissitude ever told has just reached St. Petersburg. It is to the effect that an entire tribe of the Tshuktoebes, numbering about 2,000, has just perished by its own act as the last avenue of escape from famine.

The tribe inhabited one of the bleakest parts of Yakutsk and obtained a precarious subsistence by rearing reindeer. Early in 1905 a deadly disease appeared among the deer and by Winter the entire herd had perished. The unfortunate people endured much, hoping that Spring would bring some better prospects. This hope was disappointed and, with slow starvation starting them in the face of the elders of the tribe spent a day in discussing what should be done. The almost incredible decision was that each father should first kill his family and then himself.

On the following day the appalling tragedy was carried out in the open air in a general assembly. The only exceptions were a few old men without families, who when left to themselves had not the determination necessary to commit suicide, and some of them continued to drag on a miserable existence until they were found.

Some of The Stringent Royal Rules.

Regal Etiquet at Royal Courts and Restrictions of Royal Power.

A curious curtailment of the royal prerogative is effective by an act of parliament passed in the reign of George III, which deals with Sabbath breaking. In this act it is distinctly stated that the monarch shall not have the power to pardon any persons convicted of a certain form of Sabbath breaking. Yet his majesty can, of course, pardon 90 out of every 100 prisoners in the land.

A number of years ago it was perfectly permissible, and, in fact, a matter of strict etiquette, for a visitor who should obtain an audience with the Sultan of Turkey to bow and kiss the hand of that oriental potentate. Anarchists, however, took advantage of the privilege, and on one memorable occasion a treacherous emissary drove a dagger into the heart of a sovereign, and from that time forth the privilege has been disallowed.

When the youthful King of Spain was 12 years of age he one day had the misfortune to slip and fall down a flight of the palace stairs. The fall would very probably have been attended with fatal results had it not been for a servant who extended a kindly hand and saved his young master by breaking the fall. But by a stringent rule of Spanish etiquette, no one dare even touch the sacred person of the King, and for this very grave offence the servant was at once dismissed from his position.

By a remarkable law of royal etiquette which has existed for a number of years past at the court of Siam, no person is permitted to sleep in an apartment situated above that occupied by the King. A deliberate breach of this rule has on more than one occasion been punished by death.

Recently, when the King of Siam paid a visit to Paris, a number of bedrooms were reserved directly above that in which the King was to have slept for the dusky followers of the royal visitor. The blunder caused great consternation among the fearful courtiers, until the matter was explained to the management and duly rectified.

It is a traditional etiquette custom in the Malborough family for each duke to present a Blenheim spaniel to the duchess when she enters Blenheim palace for the first time as its mistress. The story from which this custom has its origin, is that during the battle of Blenheim a spaniel followed at the heels of the great duke throughout the day, never leaving him until the victory was assured.

When the emperor or empress of China appears in public, no other person is allowed to occupy a higher place than they do. Therefore on such occasions the shutters of all buildings are drawn and the upper parts of the houses past which the royal procession is expected to move, are deserted, the inhabitants swarming to the ground floors in order to show deference to their rulers.

PAPER MILK BOTTLES

Toronto News: Paper milk bottles are now being put on the market along with paper beer bottles, paper carbonated water bottles and paper moisture-proof cigar boxes. As Canada is unquestionably the paper country of the future with her immense spruce forests, this interests us. Many advantages are claimed for the paper milk bottles over its glass competitor. In the first place, it is sterilized, while it is claimed it is difficult to sterilize a glass bottle. Then with breakages, cost of collecting and the smaller loads carried the dairies figure that the glass bottle costs between four and five dollars per thousand bottles of milk delivered, whereas the paper bottle costs \$3 per thousand and the drivers take out larger loads and make better time by reason of the fact that they do not have to wait to collect empties. The paper bottle is, of course, used only once and is then thrown away.
