We live amid matter in three characteristic states—solid, liquid and But since hydrogen has been both liquefied and solidified, the investigator, says Professor James Dewar, is introduced into a world of solid bodies. With the aid of the cold furnished by liquid hydrogen, every gaseous substance at present definitely known to the chemist, with the single exception of helium, can be solidified. Even helium, Professor Dewar hopes, may yield to the processes now being employed at the Royal Institute in Lordon Living Market and the control of the cold furnished by liquid hydrogen at the cold furnished hydrogen at the cold fur London. Liquid hydrogen is so light that the only solid substance that will float upon it is pith. Solid hydrogen has a temperature 436 deg. Fahrenheit below zero. 
