section of the city, now without
street railway facilities, with some-
means of transportation to and from
the business district of the city. It
has been suggested that electric motor
bus lines be operated and your com-
mittee is compiling data in this re-
gard and will make a report to the
council in the very near future.

Your committee to which was re-
ferred the matter of establishing a
Municipal aerodrome with a view to
promoting the development of avi-
ation throughout Canada generally
would report that the City Clerk has
written the various cities in Ontario
enquiring as to what course of ac-
tion is likely to be adopted by them.
Until this information is received
your committee will be unable to
make a definite report.

Park and Cemetery
Ald. Murphy reported for the Park
Cemetery and Civic Committee.

We report having received a de-
putation from the Industrial Athletic
Association of this city requesting
the use of the Lacrosse Grounds.
The Industrial League is composed
of twenty-two teams, from the var-
ious manufacturing plants and is
asking for the Lacrosse Grounds on
Monday night of each week during
the summer months, to take care of
a part of its schedule. Your com-
mittee would therefore recommend
that this request be and is hereby
granted and that the city clerk be
and is hereby authorized to write the
Industrial Association to that effect.

Your committee would recommend
that the city clerk be and is hereby
authorized to advertise immediately
in the local papers for applications
in writing from athletic clubs and
those desirous of using the Lacrosse
Grounds for the playing of games
during the summer in order that
your committee may be in posses-
sion of sufficient information to draw
a schedule that will be satisfactory
to all concerned.

Your committee would further re-
commend that the city clerk be au-
thorized to write the Grand Army of
Canada and the Great War Veterans
Association, as to when the privilege
of using the Park Pavilion for the
purpose of dancing was granted,
that the dancing must cease at 11
o'clock p. m., and that the privilege
of using the pavilion be from the
15th of May, 1920 to the 15th of
September, 1920.

Your committee would further re-
commend that permission be given
the Grand Army of Canada to use
Montebello Park on Victoria Day,
May 24th for the purpose of holding
a demonstration and to sell tags for
the purpose of raising funds to en-
able them to carry on their work of
caring for dependant soldiers.

Your committee further report
that they have considered the ad-
visability of having the Provincial
Highway in front of Victoria Lawn
Cemetery built as a thirty foot pave-
ment with curbs instead of a twenty
foot pavement with the usual earth
shoulders and ditches, such as is
standard construction for the Provin-
cial Highway. The building of the
wider pavement with curb will ne-
cessitate a tile drain for the drain-
age and this will take the place of
ditches. The boulevards from curb to
sidewalk may then be filled in and
beautified with grass, shrubbery or
rees and the stretch of roadway,
some two thousand feet in length,
would be a fitting decoration to Vic-
toria Lawn Cemetery, both old and

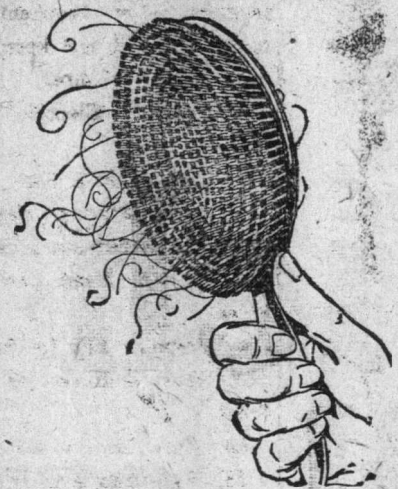

MAN MAY CARRY
HIS OWN LIQUOR

The decision handed down by Mr.
Justice Middleton in Toronto Friday
by which it was ruled that a man
may act as his own common carrier
will exercise a far-reaching effect
upon the rum running industry.

The decision was made in the case
of John Kozak, a foreigner, resid-
ing at Windsor, who brought two
suitcases of liquor from Montreal to
Windsor, ostensibly for his own use.
Kozak was arrested for a violation of
the O. T. A., his liquor confiscated
and he was fined \$500. The higher
court now rules that the fine shall be
refunded and the liquor returned to
Kozhak.

If the ruling be taken as a pre-
cedent there appears nothing to pre-
vent any number of individuals from
driving their autos to Montreal,
loading them to the guards with
"fruit of the vine" and then driving
back. They will be immune from po-
lice interference on the route and
provided they take the car to their
homes.
