WITH THE FARMERS

\$3,000,000 ELEVATOR FIRE.

Duluth, Minn., Nov. 10.—Fire of unknown origin last night caused the destruction of the Great Northern elevator "A" in Superior, together with 600,000 bushels of grain, principally wheat, which was fully insured. The elevator was owned by the Great Northern Railway, but was leased to the A. D. Thompson Grain Company, of Duluth. The sparks soon ignited the Grand Republic Mill, the Great Lakes Dredge and Dock Company's dock and the Duluth storage, which contained the finishing plant of the Webster Chair Co.

The total loss is estimated at \$2,850,000. All firms are covered by insurance. The steamer W. A. Par- ent and W. A. Rogers were in the water at the time of the fire.

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LIVERPOOL CLOSED HIGHER.

Continental markets higher. There was a million over last year. Amer- ican markets were all strong, al- though not particularly active. The advance in Chicago was 3 cents for December, 2½ for May and 1½ for July. In Minneapolis the advance was 4½ for December and 3½ for May, both markets closing at the top.

At the close Winnipeg showed an advance of 4½ for November, 4 for December and 4½ for May, the closing being ½ to ¾ under the high point of the day.

Coarse grains showed an advance ½ to ¾, trading being mainly in the May oats of No. 3 or rejected. Win- nipeg December wheat closed ½ over Chicago and ½ over Minneapolis and ½ under Duluth.

The Canadian Pacific Irrigation Col- umbian company has issued a state- ment of post-harvest conditions in southern Alberta which show the yield in that district this year to have been 4,000,000 bushels, val- ued at \$3,000,000, as compared with 2,000, 000 bushels valued at \$1,750,000.

Of this year's crop 75 per cent, will be sold in the province, the remain- ing 25 per cent, was frosted, but will make excellent feed and will sell at better price than did the best mil- ling wheat last year. The 75 per cent, milling wheat is selling for almost double the price it did last year, as will be seen from the following table of prices—
