Germans Hope to Get 4,000,000 More Men

Expect Man-Power Bill to Free that Number for Military Service. London, Dec. 24.—An Amsterdam despatch to The Daily Chronicle says: "It is becoming increasingly difficult for the German Government to keep the masses at home under control...

"Regarding the new compulsory civilian work bill, my informant says that the great masses of working people regard its proposals with the deepest suspicion and mistrust, as being likely to cause them immediate financial and social injury."
