December and the Napoleon Dynasty The month of December is remarkable for events interesting to the Napoleon family. Sixty-three years have elapsed since Napoleon L was crowned in the Ca-thedral of Notre Dame by Plus VII. On the first of December (1807) Jerome Bona-parte was proclaimed King of Westpha-lia. On the second of the same month (1905) was fought the battle of Auster-litz. On the 4th (1908) Napoleon entered Madrid. On the 16th [1849] Gitizen Louis Napoleon Bonaparte was elected Presi-dent of the French Republic. On the 12th (1790) General Bonaparte was named First Consul. On the 15th (1844) the re-mains of Napoleon arrived in Paris. On the 16th (1809) took place the divorce of Napoleon from Josephine. On the 18th (1812) Napoleon returned to Paris after the disastrous campaign of Russia. On the 23rd [1806] Napoleon defeated the Russians at Garnov. On the evening of the 24th [1900] the infernal machine ex ploded as the First Consul was going to the opera. On the 26th [1777] Marie Julie, the wife of Josephi Bonaparte was born. It was on the 5th of December. 1792, that the National Convention de-creed the penalty of death against all who expected grain from the territory of the Republic. 
