**Increase of Heart Disease.**

An evil recognized is sometimes half cured; and the intellectual classes, looking at figures such as those which Dr. Quain has displayed in his interesting Lancelian Lectures at the College of Physicians on "Disease of the Walls of the Heart," may well consider the propriety of attending to the hygiene of their lives, as well as of their houses; and remember that, to enjoy and benefit by even pure air, soil, and water they must avoid disabling heart and brain by incessant labours which too often make successful lives joyless, and embitter the harvest of the crop which has been too diligently sown. These warning figures tell that, during the last twenty years, the total of deaths of males at all ages from heart disease, has increased in number from 5,746 in 1851, to 12,428 in 1870. The percentage of deaths from heart disease for 1,000 of population living was 755 between the years 1851 and 1855; it has risen to 1,085 from 1866 to 1870. This increase, it must be observed too, has taken place wholly in connection with the working years of actual social life. There is no change in the percentage of deaths from this cause in males under 25 years of age. Between 20 and 45 years of age it has risen from 553 to 709, and that almost exclusively in males, for there is almost no increase in the percentage of females dying from heart disease during the twenty-five years of life from 21 to 45. These figures convey their own lesson, and warn us to take a little more care not to kill ourselves for the sake of living.—*British Medical Journal.*


