London, Nov. 25. - Lord Rosebery spoke to three thousand people on the fiscal question at the Surrey Theater tonight. There were 20,000 applications for tickets, the issue of which had to be limited to the capacity of the theater. Lord Rosebery afterwards addressed a large overflow meeting. At both meetings he was given an enthusiastic reception, and all through his speech he was warmly cheered. Among those present at the meetings were a number of members of the House of Commons and others prominent to public life. His lordship's remarks were for the most part devoted to ridiculing Joseph Chamber-

lain and his policy.
"After last night's meeting at Queen's Hall, which was attended by seven members of Lord Rosebery's Government," said the speaker, "little could be added. The fiscal question must be solved and finally solved. The dissolution of Parliament cannot be
