WINGED ARMY DRIVEN TO SEA 8

Vast Numbers of Birds Land on Ship 500 Miles From the Coast.

New York, Oct. 19 .- The Scotch bark, Pass, of Killiecrankie, which now occupies the most commanding berth in the harbor, was made a way station on her trip here by flocks of birds | blown off shore.

Leaving Passage Dock,the little port between Queenstown and Cork,a storm drove the Pass of Killiecrankie south to the Bay of Biscay. Knowing the uselessness of trying to beat across the Atlantic in ballast Capt. Vint kept | on to the southward for the trades, and to the westward of Bermuda felt the alarming accompaniment of heat, V humidity and tumbling barometer, which was the effect of the West Indian cyclone.

In the latitudes of 24 and 25, the sun being on the other side of the equator and the wind northeast, vast numbers of birds, which had been driven off shore, alighted on the Pass of Killiecrankie. As nearly as Captain Vint could calculate there were hundreds of them, dippers, swallows, hawks, oyster catchers, snipe, frigates, gulls, terns and loons. All appeared to be much exhausted and were glad to rest on either rigging or deck.
