

LIBERALS SURE OF VICTORY ON FUTURE ISSUES

Tackle Problems of Wheat Board With Enthusiasm Born of Budget Triumph.

MEIGHEN BATTLES BOARD

Doubts Grievances of Western Farmers Are As Great As Represented.

OTTAWA, June 14.—With a burst of enthusiasm born of the budget victory, the government tackled the wheat board, the most complicated problem of the present session, today, and then to prove that it had not wearied from two weeks of monotonous debate, it carried on with estimates until long after midnight.

The government moved with more certainty today, for the budget vote has assured the Liberal party that it can carry on successfully, though numerically it seems no stronger than the combined strength of the two other parties.

The vote of Wednesday night proved beyond a doubt, it was pointed out today, that the Progressives of the east have more things in common with the Liberal party than they have with the western group of their party, and therein lies the strength for the government.

Because the Progressives from Ontario represent as a rule thriving towns and business centres, as well as rural districts, they cannot go to the extremes desired by the western men, and so if they conscientiously serve their constituents, as they do, they must cast their lot with the government on big issues, giving it a majority as surely as if they were members of the Liberal party.

It was pointed out also that several of the Progressives were not opposed by Liberal candidates in the last election, and that they were elected by Liberal as well as Progressive votes. For this reason the members must always regard how their action affects both sections of their supporters.

Confidence of Future.
Taking these things into consideration and the fact that they were practically illustrated Wednesday night, the government is facing the future with a confidence such as it did not know before.

At the opening of the house today Mr. Kay (Liberal) Mississauga, chairman of the committee on agriculture and colonization, moved concurrence in the fifth report of this committee, which was presented to the house on May 26.

The report recommends that an act be passed, creating a national wheat marketing agency for the marketing of the wheat crop of 1922 to become effective as soon as two or more provinces have conferred upon this agency such powers possessed by the wheat board of 1919 as come within provincial jurisdiction.

In moving concurrence Mr. Kay said that the wheat board question had been raised by a memorandum from the Canadian Council of Agriculture, asking for restoration of such a board.

Mr. Kay said that it should be provided that any province taking advantage of concurrent legislation to establish the board should become responsible and possessed of any profits accruing.

Right Hon. Arthur Meighen declared that the house should not be asked to vote on the resolution without a declaration of policy from the government.

Meighen Makes Reply.
The resolution provided, he said, that the wheat board was not to come into existence until at least two provinces had granted every single power within the provincial jurisdictions enjoyed by the old board. After that was done the board was not to become operative until the issue of a proclamation by the government.

It was altogether unlikely that Ontario or the Eastern Provinces would pass the concurrent legislation. Hardly any person would suggest that Manitoba would act while in the throes of a provincial election. Saskatchewan and Alberta might concur. The people of these provinces were desirous of establishing the board.

But the provinces were being asked to supply the board with compulsory powers in such a way as to leave them very little discretion.

Wabash Freight Train Wrecked At Tillsonburg, Loss Totals \$50,000

TILLSONBURG, June 14.—A serious wreck occurred on the main line of the Wabash at the diamond here during Tuesday night, and the loss is estimated at \$50,000 to the company. The accident is thought to have been caused by a car jumping the track in the center of a long refrigerator train, and before the engine could be brought to a standstill fourteen cars had piled up in the air. Butter and tobacco were strewn along the tracks for 300 yards, and as a result of sightseers with autos loading up from the wreckage it is rumored several arrests will follow for theft.

down until the 27th of July. After that date the board had organized and was ready to handle the wheat crop when it started to move in September. He quite understood that there were legal difficulties in the way of the Dominion Parliament providing compulsory powers and that provincial legislation was necessary for that purpose.

The best thing for the Dominion Parliament to do was to adopt the report, allow the legislation to be brought down and then approach the matter with an earnest desire to get a workable scheme. He saw no reason to doubt that the Alberta and Saskatchewan Legislatures would meet and pass the necessary concurrent legislation. The whole idea behind the creation of a board was to prevent the flooding of the market in the fall when 75 per cent of the crop was likely to be rushed on to the market if not handled by such a body. He was not a lawyer, but

thought legal difficulties could be overcome.

It was very unlikely that any American wheat would be imported into Canada and sold through the board. Mr. Crear thought the board of 1919 would have functioned just as good if no embargo had been placed on wheat. The reason why farmers got such a good price in 1919 was because the British Government was buying wheat wherever it could and paying any price asked, to offset any possible danger from the threatened coal and transportation tie-ups. He could not see why the board should not sell to millers. He did not think there was any value whatever in Mr. Meighen's scheme for a voluntary pool, because any voluntary agency would not have any elementary between Winnipeg and Calgary and would therefore have no wheat to sell. The amount of wheat being sold over loading platforms

was growing less each year; moreover, the elevator companies could handle the sale of wheat better than any government agency.

FINDS "MARCH" ON PELEE A FIZZLE

CHATHAM, June 14.—With considerable finality, Sergeant Birtwhistle, who has been for the past few days in charge of the squad of mounted police at Point Pelee, sent there to resist a reported invasion of the point by Pottawatimies Indians, declared tonight that there was nothing to the "march" on Point Pelee of the tribesmen.

Sergeant Birtwhistle is returning to Windsor, the headquarters of the mounties in Western Ontario.

SUPPORT FRENCH PLAN FOR INQUIRY

LONDON, June 14.—The British government has agreed to the French proposal to limit the period to be covered by the investigation into atrocities in Asia Minor to the last year, it was stated in well-informed circles today, but has declined to punish the guilty in view of the United States attitude, which favors merely making known the facts in the case.

The British also have declined to re-investigate alleged Greek excesses during the evacuation of Ismid last June.

The appointment of a commission for the Asia Minor investigation, it was said, is to be left to the four high commissioners in Constantinople.

DIES AS RESULT OF FALL.

TIMMINS, June 14.—While a pump platform was being moved yesterday over one of the tanks in the mill at the McIntyre mine, a young man named Spoules lost his footing and fell to the cement floor, a distance of about eighteen feet, dislocating his neck. The lad lived only a couple of hours.
