THE MONTH'S LOW DEATH-RATE.

Analysis of the Returns of the City Interments—The Figures Still Below the Average. The mortality returns for the present month are slightly in excess of those for November, but considerably below the average for December.

Among the certified causes of the 194 deaths were the following: Diphtheria, 10; typhoid fever, 4; scarlet fever, 1; apoplexy, 2; paralysis, 2; falling from window, 1; kick of horse, 1; suicide, 1; burning, 1.

These figures show an increase of 8 compared with a total of 185 compared with December, 1893. Of the 194 deaths, 105 were males and 89 were females.

At St. James' Cemetery there was the smallest number of interments since the month of December during the past seven years. Compared with December, last year, there were 10 interments less.

At St. Michael's there was a decrease of 22 deaths, compared with December of last year, and a decrease of 8 compared with November, '94. Only 33 persons were interred: the children among them were 10.
