Dupee & Co., Chicago: The incentive to-day was the Illinois report, making the condition 62 against 92 in May, the Michigan State report making the winter wheat condition 73, a springing up of a sharp cash demand and increasing anxiety over the Government figures, which will be out Monday afternoon. The cash business possibly exceeded 200,000 bushels. There was a sale of one lot of 100,000 bushels to Toledo. All the cash handlers sold more or less. The Modern Miller estimated the winter wheat crop at 215,000,000 bushels, putting the condition at 60. This was one of the last influences on the market. Among the lesser ones was the report of hot winds of California and an estimate that the visible on Monday would decrease 3,000,000 bushels. The export clearances for the week, 2,991,000 bushels, were 500,000 bushels over the week before. It is not likely that the Government condition on winter wheat will be as low as the private ones. The lowest condition on record is the one in 1885, 62 in June. That was the year when the total wheat yield was only 357,000,000 bushels. Corn advanced fractionally in sympathy with wheat. Receipts were moderate, 228 cars; Monday estimate 225. There was some comment on the low temperatures in the extreme Northwest, but no one had the temerity to talk frost. The cash demand was only moderate; no charters were made. There were good-sized shipments, 328,000 bushels. The trade was not very large.
