1 cup brown sugar
1 cup shortening
1 cup molasses
1 cup boiling water

3 cups flour

1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
A little nutmeg or other flavoring.

Put shortening, sugar and molasses in bowl, add boiling water and mix thoroughly; add spices. Dissolve the baking soda in a little hot water, pour into the mixture and quickly add the sifted flour, beat up well then stir in the Delecto. Pour into a paper lined bread loaf pan and bake in a moderate oven for about one hour. Do not have oven too hot when nearly done.
