Camp Meeting at Berwick, N.S., this year is arranged for Aug. 9th-17th. Evangelist engaged is the Rev. O. S. Gray, who was the leading assisting Evangelist in the Chapman Alexander meeting held lately in Toronto.

A belated March snow-storm arrived on Sunday, the ninth of April and over half a foot of snow fell. Sleights were out on Monday but before night were replaced by wheels, only enough of the snow remaining to make the "going" decidedly unpleasant.

The Longmire schooners, Frances and Dorothy, arrived in port on Saturday with full cargoes of merchandise for our merchants from St. John. The Dorothy left on Monday for St. John to take on a cargo for Annapolis. The Frances leaves today with a mixed cargo for St. John to return with merchandise for Bridgetown.

The spring openings of the military establishments of Bridgetown took place last week. 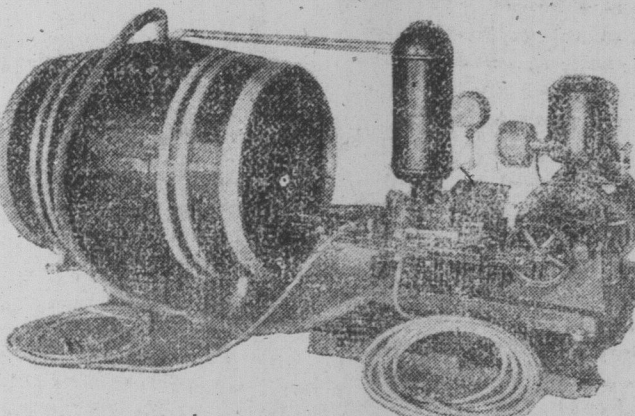
